NDPTC Develops and Delivers Training Across the Country

As of the end of FY 2018, NDPTC's course offerings included twenty FEMA-certified courses and four courses in development or final certification. In FY 2018, NDPTC delivered 198 trainings to over 5,137 participants in the United States and Territories. NDPTC has increased the number of participants trained in each federal fiscal year by over 150%. NDPTC has trained participants from all 10 FEMA regions and across 20 different disciplines.

Our Vision: To be the premier, trusted provider of risk-based natural hazards training focused on underserved, vulnerable populations living in hazardous, coastal, and island communities.

Major Accomplishments


- Developed paperless registration system.

- Delivered training in Puerto Rico, U.S. Virgin Islands and CNMI in response to major disaster declarations.




NDPTC Training Deliveries by FEMA Region 2010 - 2018

Participants Trained by FEMA Region 2010 - 2018






2018 Disciplines Trained






Deliveries by Course 2018
